News from 29th June 2013, Large Skipper on Common Spotted Orchid in Upper Green garden, Tewin. Speckled Wood seen most days - Jim Farr

At Bricket Wood Common this am 10+ speckled woods, 8+ brimstones, 4 Meadow Brown, 1 large Skipper and **a possible Purple Hairstreak** also 1 Small Tortoiseshell in my St. Albans garden early evening - Andrew Steele

Clouded Yellow near Panshanger today, looked like a helice pale female form - Andrew Wood

Clouded Yellow, at Heartwood today - west side of site on large area of clover - Martin Webb

We saw a female Clouded yellow nectaring on comfrey at Thorley Wash Nature Reserve this afternoon - Jenny Sherwen

Small Tortoiseshell in the Hitchin garden this mornng - Nigel Agar

A worn Small Copper (my first of the year) seen in the field north of Pigeonswick Cottage and 2 Small Whites, 10+ Speckled Woods and 2 Peacocks elsewhere in Norton Green today - Peter Clarke

High Wych, my largest count of Small tortoiseshell for many years today with a mind blowing 7 (this was a years worth of sightings only a few years ago) sunning along the path between the rapeseed fields ENE of the village on the way to the Rivers hospital/orchard site this morning, at the site on the main fields the sward has been allowed to grow very high this year and this has shaded out the clover and thyme plants, floral diversity has taken a hit here, the only butterflies seen, fitting in with the new long sward, 11 Large skipper, but surprisingly 1 Brown argus in their

usual spot but where none were seen last year, across the rest of the site in a more favorable sward, 3 Large skipper, 19 Meadow brown, 3 Common blue all males, 5 Speckled wood (in the shady track between the fields), 1 Small tortoiseshell, and a large pinky Nymphalid that whizzed through most likely a Painted lady, also 2 Bee orchids and 3 Pyramidal orchids - Laurence Drummond

## Saturday 29th June 2013

At Merryhill Fields, Bushey =  $26 \times \text{meadow brown}$ ,  $10 \times \text{large skipper}$ ,  $2 \times \text{small skipper}$  ( my first of year),  $6 \times \text{brimstone}(1 \text{ female})$ ,  $3 \times \text{common blue}$ ,  $1 \times \text{ringlet}$  ( my first of year),  $2 \times \text{peacock}$ ,  $2 \times \text{speckled wood}$ ,  $2 \times \text{small tortoiseshell}$ ,  $1 \times \text{burnet companion}$ ,  $3 \times \text{straw dot}$ ,  $2 \times \text{green oak tortrix}$ ,  $1 \times \text{yellow shell}$ . - David Gower

Bricket Wood Common - Speckled Woods are the stars of the show today, with 20 recorded on todays transect walk. Brimstones are still out in force with a total split evenly between males and females. A few summer butterflies have started to emerge with just 1 Ringlet, 2 Meadow Browns and 4 Large Skippers. Other sightings included a Green veined White and a Small Magpie Moth. Butterfly World, Chiswell Green - only a mile away, but in butterfly world this site is on a different planet this week with little overlap in terms of species. Today I saw **7 Small Blues, 27 Common Blues, 1 Clouded Yellow, 7 Small Tortoiseshells** 4 six spot Burnet moth, 5 Yellow Shell, 3 Burnet Companion, 21 Meadow Browns and. 2 Large Skippers - Malcolm Hull

A walk round Oughtonhead today, saw good numbers of Brimstone, 2x Red Admiral, 2xMeadow Brown, 1xSpeckled Wood and Common Blue - Kevin Taylor

Took an enjoyable walk across Hertford heath and round Balls wood. Balls wood looks superb now with the work that has been done there, Speckled woods made up the vast majority of the sightings with 50+ around the area, the late spring has certainly slowed things down, others included just 2 Large skipper, 2 Meadow brown and a Small tortoiseshell. Danemead could only give 1 Speckled wood. I tried my local elms at Pole hole farm but no WLH seen, also 1 fresh Small tortoiseshell here - Laurence Drummond

Sightings 29/6/13 - Hatfield Aerodrome (Disused) - Ellenbrook Fields Small heath x 5 Speckled Wood x 1 - David Wheatcroft

I saw a male orange tip today at Bayfordbury and another male orange tip near Essendon this afternoon. - Shaun Dowman

In Barnes Lane, Kings Langley between 1-2pm we saw many small tortoiseshells. Two were mud puddling by the roadside near nettles and brambles and further up the lane near the A41 bypass a field full of scentless mayweed and pineapple weed revealed at least 9 small tortoiseshells! On the verge opposite there was a late cinnabar moth and a my first ringlet - Elizabeth Debenham

A catch up listing. June 9th, We saw less than 20 common blues at Bunkers Lane, Hemel Hempstead ox eye daisy field. June 16th, also in Bunkers Lane Hemel Hempstead we saw a few common blues. June 17th ,found a Burnet Companion at Bunkers and about 10 common blues. June 19th, a green veined white in Kings Langley nectaring on Herb Robert. June 24th, in Bunkers field about 9 common blues and several burnet cocoons. At Bricket Wood Common this pm despite the cloud I saw 1 Painted Lady, 8 Large Skippers, 8+ Speckled Wood, 6 Brimstone at least 1 pair dancing and 3 Meadow browns plus a Hornet in the woods and at least 4 Broad- bodied Chaser on the common - Andy Steele

East of Redbourn today I saw my first meadow browns (3), ringlets (2) and large skippers (3) of the year, along with 2 brimstones and 3 speckled woods. Ian Flack

At Balls Wood today my first large skipper of the year - Andy Brown

Two Speckled Wood in Tottenham Cemetery today Thursday 27th June 2013 at 11:58 hrs. - Robert Callf

#### Wednesday 26th June 2013

I had some very good sightings yesterday at Butterfly World, over the whole Transect I recorded 41 Common Blues, 6 Small Blues, 1 Large White, 2 Small Whites, **Clouded Yellow,** Small Heath, 4 Meadow Browns, 2 Small Tortoiseshell, 3 Large Skippers - Mandy Floyd

Seen today (26th June) at Bedfont Lakes country park was a single **Clouded yellow**, along the path adjacent the railway line posing for several minutes before flying onto the nearby hedgeline. - Rob Solomon

In Bushey garden 1 x yellow shell , 1 x light brown apple moth. At Merryhill Fields, Bushey 4 x meadow brown (my first of year), 2 x speckled wood, 3 x large skipper ( my first of year), 1 x small tortoiseshell, 1 x brimstone(male). At Water Lane 15+ nettle tap moths, 2 x speckled wood, 1 brimstone (male), 1 x small tortoiseshell, 1 x yellow shell, 3 x treble bar, 1 x common blue, 1 x large skipper. Lastly 3 x speckled wood at Fishers Field - David Gower

Last Wednesday (19th June) on the transect I saw a **dark green fritillary**, 2 green hairstreak, 3 dingy skipper, 1 grizzled skipper, large skipper, green veined white, 3 brimstone, small copper, 5 brown argus, 8 common blue, 21 small heath and 9 meadow brown. Today was very productive, I had my first **marbled white and ringlet**, lots of meadow brown and small heath, small copper, brimstone, white sp,large skipper, brown argus, common blue, 3+ dark green fritillary and 2 very fresh looking grizzled skipper. - Paul Thrush

In an hour spent at Bricket Wood Common I saw 3 Large Skippers, 2 Speckled Wood, 8 Brimstone (mostly female). No sign of White Admiral or SW Frit but the brambles are just coming into flower so shouldn't be long now - Robin Pearson

A few sightings today 26th June 2013 - 1 Speckled Wood at Oakwood, N14 at 11:58 hrs. 1 Speckled Wood at Houndsden Gutter, N21 at 12:25 hrs. 3 Speckled Wood at Grovelands Park, N14 and 1 Burnet Companion here. - Robert Callf

Very little sunshine at Norton Green earlier this afternoon so very few butterflies were flying but saw 3 Small Whites, 1 Large White, 1 Speckled Wood and 1 Common Blue (which I failed to find here last year!) - Peter Clarke

News from Diane Andrews. A visit to Forty Hall meadows today recorded 76 Chimney Sweeper moths, 1 Mother Shipton, 1 Silver Y, 1 Large Skipper, 5 Speckled Wood and 3 Meadow Brown. In a different tetrad the New River Walk she found 50 Peacock larvae on nettles.

On my walk around Tyttenhanger Gravel Pits today I saw 2 Small Heath, 4 Whites, 2 Small Tortoiseshell,1 Peacock, 1 Cinnabar and my first Large Skipper of the year - Terry Wood

Skipper, at Little Beechill Wood, Enfield Chase, 10:55 hrs; 3 male Meadow Brown at Little Beechill Wood, 10:55 - 11:00 hrs; 1 Large White, at Vault Hill Wood, Enfield Chase, 11:03 hrs; 1 Peacock, at Vault Hill Wood, 11:04 hrs; 1 Speckled Wood, at Vault Hill Wood, 11:05 hrs; 1 Small Copper, set-aside field near Dew Pond, Trent Park, 12:35 hrs; 1 male Orange Tip, at South Lodge Farm and Vicarage Farm, along Merryhills Brook, 13:25 hrs onwards; 1 Peacock, along Merryhills Brook/Vicarage Farm, 13:28 hrs. Robert Callf & Robin White

I did my weekly walk across the Hay Field on Harpenden Common this morning (Tuesday 25 June). The scorching sun (the temperature reached 14 degrees) brought out 1 Meadow Brown, 1 Small Heath and 1 Green-veined White. Apart from a couple of yellow Shell moths there were few other insects around. The good news is that the flowers in the Hay Field are very spectacular indeed and it is well worth going there to see them - Alan Jackson

Wood Lane, Pirton, nice to see a late Orange tip + Red Admiral, speckled woods there on 20th June - Stuart Pittman

## Monday 24th June 2013

Sightings for Monday 24th June 2013 - 1 Small Tortoiseshell, along Leeging Beech Gutter near Stables at Vicarage Farm, Enfield, 10:35 hrs - our first of the summer-brood; 1 male Meadow Brown, along Leeging Beech Gutter near Stables at Vicarage Farm, 10:40 hrs; 1 Clouded Border, at Parkside Farm, on Res banking; 1 Speckled Wood, near Dew Pond, Trent Park, 13:12 hrs; 1 Speckled Wood, along Merryhills Brook/Vicarage Farm, 13:50 hrs; 2 Large Skipper, along Merryhills Brook/Vicarage Farm, 13;52 hrs. Robert Callf & Robin White

Went back to Water Lane, Watford early evening. Sightings were 1 x skipper (probably large but not 100% sure), 3 x common white wave, 9 x yellow shell, 40 x nettle tap. At fishers field 1 x yellow shell & 8 x nettle tap. 4 x light brown apple moths in our Bushey garden tonight - David Gower

Saw a male Orange Tip at Park Farm, Enfield (TQ285983) near Ferny Hill on Thursday 20th June 2013 at 15:45 hrs - still looked fresh, also a male Common Blue at 'Old Golf Course' Trent Park at 15:30 hrs. - Robert Callf

We (wife and family) visited Aldbury Nowers NR on **16 June 2013** (late morning). Overcast but occasional bright spells. Spotted 2 Peacock, 1 Common Blue (male), 2 Dingy Skippers, 10 Small Heath and **one large fritillary** (*accepted as Dark Green*) on the wing which I would probably say was a Dark Green Fritillary. It didn't look like a Silver-washed Fritillary. Unfortunately, only saw it for 20-30 secs before losing sight of it when it went to ground so I never saw it's underwing. ## Sunday 23rd June 2013

At 4p.m had a look around Water Lane, Watford. Noted 4 x speckled wood, 6 x yellow shell moths, 2 x common white wave, 6 x nemophora degeerella. Actually spotted 70-100 micro moths but despite photos unable to id yet (The 70-100 moths seen in Water Lane were nettle tap moths.!) - David Gower

Bricket Wood Common - at last, the start of summer! But today's weather was more typical of early Spring, mostly cloudy with showers and sunny spells and the temperature struggling to get to 17 degrees. New species for the year on this site today were Large Skipper (1 seen) and Silver Ground Carpet Moth (1). Also a new flush of Speckled Woods (7). Male and Female Brimstone both still out - 3 seen all nectaring on creeping thistle, also a single Small White, nectaring on Meadow Vetchling - Malcolm Hull

Oak Hill Woods---LNR East Barnet------23/6/13 -20 final instar L White larvae on single small Garlic mustard plant----- --2x Peacock first instar nests on nettle in centre of field away from hedgerows----- 20x Tshell 3ird instar larvae---on same nettle bed------ -4x 2nd instar Brimstone larvae on very small P Buckthorn cutting isolated in woodland glade - Kitt Jones

#### Saturday 22nd June 2013

Wednesday 19 June. Late report, but on my Warren transect I recorded 21 Small Heath & 3 fresh male Common Blue. Small Heaths seem to be thriving this year - I've already recorded many more than in the whole of last year. Hopefully the Blues will make a similar recovery. Otherwise a few

assorted Whites, 1 Peacock & 6 Cinnabars. Hopefully Marbled White & Meadow Brown will show soon - John Moss

I walked around Stocker's Lake this afternoon and saw two butterflies during the occasional brighter interludes: a small tortoiseshell and a red admiral (my first of the year) - Ian Flack

## Friday 21st June 2013

Saw two male Large Skippers at Whitewebbs Park this afternoon Friday 21st June 2013 at 14:03 and 14:05 hrs. - Robert Callf

## Thursday 20th June 2013

1 x brimstone moth in Bushey garden tonight - David Gower

Very few butterflies encountered on my walk around Tyttenhanger Gravel pits today - 1 Peacock, 1 Small Heath, 1 Common Blue, 1 Large White and 1 Cinnabar. But I have to add that yesterday in my South Mimms garden I saw 1 Comma, and 1 fairly late Orange Tip. - Terry Wood

Saw my first **Meadow brown** and large skipper in field next to Bencroft wood. At Waterford heath south very late orange tip and grizzled skipper, plenty of common blues - Steve Kiln

A couple of common blues and a couple of whites plus one peacock on the chalk bank at King's Meads today 19th - Andy Brown

2 Small Heaths in the Hay Field, Harpenden Common, this morning (18 June) - Alan Jackson

An afternoon walk at Oughtonhead only the two Butterflys seen again 1 Common Blue, 1 Brimstone - Kevin Taylor

## Monday 17th June 2013

News from Diane Andrews, a visit to Trent Park today, found **5 Chimney Sweeper** moths but no butterflies other than 18 Small Heath, also 1 Mother shipton and 1 Straw Dot moth

## **Sunday 16th June 2013**

I had a quick look at the Grizzled skipper site near Hoo Wood today on the way back from my walk. Unfortunately I didn't see any - infact I only saw three buttrflies all day. The only butterfly I saw on the Grizzled Skipper site - was an extremely worn Dingy Skipper. It would be nice to see some common butterflies there! - Ian Carle

Butterfly World, Chiswell Green, St Albans - HMBC Branch Field Trip - Despite the dire weather forecast, 8 people showed up. The weather was mostly cloudy, but a few sunny spells allowed us to see a few butterflies. Common Blues were the most numerous with 12-14, mostly males seen sunbathing & occasionally nectaring in the meadows. We had three, possibly five sightings of Small Blue, the main target species. They were seen in two distinct areas of the site & posed obligingly for photographers. The larval food plant, Kidney Vetch is still plentiful on the chalk slopes & on other areas of the site. Brown Argus & Large Skipper were both recorded, as were Large, Small & Green-veined White, Common Carpet, Cinnabar Moth & many Burnet Companions. The sheer variety of wild flowers, birds & insects makes this a very rewarding sire to visit - Malcolm Hull - Malcolm Hull

#### Saturday 15th June 2013

Stanwell Moor, sunshine really was at a premium again today, it was windy, and mid-afternoon there was a prolonged downpour. However, I set off round my local patch regardless, knowing there'll aways be something. I started off with the sheltered glade by the River Colne today, where the wind at least couldn't reach. This was occupied by a couple of Speckled Woods and a Red Admiral: as I've commented before there is always one in residence here year in year out. Moving on to the more open areas, when the sun shone the Small Heaths appeared - an attempt at counting them reached 25, but they were so wind-blown it was difficult to be sure. I counted ten Common Blues as well, including two females, and two Large Skippers keeping to the more sheltered bits. Other than that, a couple of Green-veined, one Small and one Large White completed the picture. I had seen a group of three Holly Blues close to home yesterday, but none appeared today. I kept an eye out for Orange Tip caterpillars too, and found them on most clumps of garlic mustard I examined. Oddly, I have yet to find a Green-veined White caterpillar on these plants, though it is certainly one they eat.

News for Friday 14th June 2013 - 1 Peacock at Whitewebbs Park, 17:00 hrs, 1 Small Tortoiseshell, at Whitewebbs Park, 17:02 hrs - worn! 1 male Brimstone at Hilly Fields Park, Enfield at 17:15 hrs. Also saw an 'orange' butterfly around Flash Lane Aqueduct briefly - probably just a Comma. - Robert Callf

News for Thursday 13th June 2013 - 1 Speckled Wood, at Park Farm, Enfield, at 15:07 hrs; 1 male Orange Tip, at Park Farm, Enfield, at 15:10 hrs; 2 Silver-ground Carpet, at Little Beechill Wood, Enfield Chase; Silver Y, at Little Beechill Wood, Enfield Chase; 1 Speckled Wood, at Vault Hill Wood, Enfield Chase, at 15:37 hrs. - Robert Callf

At the weekend I found a single orange egg of an orange tip butterfly underneath the flower head on five separate garlic mustard plants in my garden in Bounds Green North London. Four days later I now have five caterpillars sitting on the now flowerless heads of five plants ranging in length from 6 to 12mm. The attached photos are of the larger one. In the close up you can see droplets of what Jeremy Thomas discusses in "The Butterflies of Britain and Ireland" as possibly being a sweet liquid to attract ants, but as he says in his book there is no signs of ants taking an interest as yet. single White Ermine moth & 2 Cinnabar were also seen. In our garden in Pinner for the last 2-3 weeks we have had 1,2 or occasionally 3 Holly Blues whenever the weather is suitable. Also, a number of Orange Tips which have appeared most days have kindly deposited their eggs on several Lady's Smocks - Gill & Tony Porter

Had a good walk around Waterford Heath today,most of the Butterflys I saw was on the bank by the picnic table. 6+ Brown Argus, 3 Grizzled Skipper, 3 Small Heath, 2 Small Copper, 2 Common Blue, Holly Blue, and a Peacock - Kevin Taylor

Tower Hamlets Cemetery Park - 8 Common Blues, 3 Burnet Companions, 13 Brimstones, 2 Speckled Woods, 4 Large Whites, 17 Small/Green-veined Whites, 1 Holly Blue, 1 Large Red Damselfly. I saw about 40 Kidney Vetch plants, but no sign of Small Blue - Malcolm Hull

**23rd May Stanwell Moor**: Around 1700: poor weather day, but a burst of late sun. Two GVW and a Small White.

**26th May Stanwell Moor**: A glorious day, which I limited to looking around my local patch. It was a day dominated by white butterflies, with all three species much in evidence, plus several Orange Tips and Brimstones. Completing the picture were ten or so Holly Blues, five rather tatty Peacocks and a couple of Speckled Woods. I'm still waiting for Small Heaths, Brown Argus and Common Blues to make an appearance.

**1st June Stanwell Moor**: I stayed local today, and walked along the extended version of my usual ramble by the River Colne right up to the road through Colnbrook. I was pleased to see that at long last the Common Blues were out (but only two thus far, a male and a female about half a mile apart unfortunately!), and also the Small Heaths. This is one long colony, or a series of linked colonies, and in full swing can boast butterflies into three figures. Today, I counted 30 or so over quite a wide area, and in some of the hotspots (by the link bridge to Heathrow T5, for example), five or six were jousting together. It is clear they prefer areas where the soil is poor and the grass grows thinly, so what is after all just an enormous spoil heap suits them pretty well. The other species in any numbers seen today was the Peacock. I counted eight in various places, basking, nectaring on buttercups, or just swooping and diving just for the hell of it. Most were rather worn, but others still amazingly bright with life in them still - quite possibly a whole year on from when they were black and spiny, munching the riverside nettle beds. Also seen were a couple of Holly Blues, a Speckled Wood, a variety of Whites and a Brimstone or two, but not one Orange Tip. I also found a Small Tortoiseshell larval web.

2nd June Harmondsworth Moor: Still local, I had an afternoon wander around Harmondsworth

Moor. This is normally good for Common Blues and Brown Argus, but none were to be seen today. Four or five Small Heaths were out, but nothing like the numbers I had seen earlier not that far away. In fact, there really wasn't much to be seen at all - a couple of Peacocks and a few Whites. Most of these appeared to be Large Whites, and as the sun was a bit come-and-go, I tracked a female, then a male down and managed some reasonable pictures of this relatively awkward customer.

**3rd June Stanwell Moor**: A gentle stroll today around the shorter version of my local area walk. Before long I encountered what I took to be a Holly Blue, flying around and over the nettles, brambles and ivy-entwined shrubs by the river. Just to check, I took a long shot of it when it settled, and discovered that it was in fact a Common Blue some considerable distance from where I normally see them. I can only speculate where the colony actually is... There were ten or so Small Heaths in the small fraction of their habitat here that today's walk took in, popping up out of the grass each time the sun re-emerged from a cloud, plus an inevitable Peacock still defending the same patch of path that he did yesterday. With sun forecast for some days to come, he could still be around next week. Aside from that there was a genuine Holly Blue, and several Whites. These included the whitest male Small White I've ever seen, to the extent that the photos I tried to take were so over-white that no detail showed at all. There was also a very bright white Greenveined male, with which I had (marginally) more success, and a more standard Small White with a lovely lemon underside.

Oak Hill Woods LNR East Barnet-------I female Brimstone egg laying on very small self set Alder Buckthorn plants whilst ignoring the large and luxurious mature shrubs-------Female orange tip egg laying on Garlic mustard-------Every year the woodland floor beneath the Wych Elms is carpeted with the leaf buds and flowers of the trees------these are bitten off by grey squirrels. These shoots often contain the doomed larvae of WLH----which cannot make it back to living shoots still on the trees.-----The Wych elms near footpaths are not so badly affected, due to the presence of dog walkers and pedestrians disturbing the squirrels. Even though the "footpath trees" appear to be in less favourable aspects for WLH---they always produce WLH in season. The trees that are stripped by the squirrels although being in sheltered sunny areas hardly ever have WLH adults. The hypothesis is that grey squirrels can have a significant negative impact on small local populations of WLH-----------Kitt Jones

Inspired by (and jealous of) Andrew Wood's discovery of Silver-washed Fritillary larvae, I visited Balls Wood today in the hope of finding a White Admiral larva. Although I'd read up on the egglaying habits of the females and I was confident that the larvae would by now be large enough to spot, in my four hours there I didn't find a single one. But I did see 20+ Speckled Wood, 15+ m Orange-tip, 15+ 'small white butterflies', 6 Peacock, 5 Large White, 2 Green-veined White, 1 Comma and 1 Mother Shipton - Paul Why

Stanwell Moor, today was a different sort of day: I didn't get out round my local area until three, and it was windy, quite cool, but with longish sunny spells. I saw a few Holly Blues (but not like yesterday's abundance), five or six Speckled Woods, one Peacock, and a selection of Whites. I approached one or two - the first was a female Orange Tip, and all the others identifiable turned out to be Green-veined Whites today. In addition, I saw six or seven male Orange Tips, battling against the wind and settling fairly readily every time the sun dimmed. Photo opportunities increased - but the wind made things very trying!

## Sunday 12th May 2013

Stanwell Moor, an hour or so around my local patch on a reasonably sunny Sunday morning provided a fair bit of interest. Once again, by far the most numerous butterfly was the Holly Blue.

There must have been twenty or more altogether, often in groups of two or three, both males and females. They were more inclined than usual to settle lower down for some reason, which was good. In addition, Small and Green-veined Whites were frequent, along with Orange Tips of both sexes. There was also a solitary male Large White, only just bigger than his cousins. Speckled Woods were also well in evidence, definitely a better showing than last year, but with no Peacocks and only one Comma (a female I suspect, as it was crawling over low-level nettle and hop leaves), they may well have had their time in the sun. Finally, there was one Red Admiral, occupying a riverside glade territory that has attracted his forebears certainly since I started walking this route seven years ago. He had to share it with a couple of Speckled Woods and several Holly Blues - which kept him very busy.

Sunday morning at Fir & Pond Woods NR....13 orange tips ... perhaps reflecting the number of cuckoo flowers in bloom on the Reserve. Also 1 peacock, 4 gvws and 8 unidentified whites. - David Gompertz

Despite the unpromising weather forecast I ventured out to Bricket Wood Common this morning. Three new species recorded for the transect this year - Orange Tip (2, both female, 1 nectaring on Garlic Mustard), Holly Blue (1, taking moisture/salts from a patch of mud) & Orange Underwing moth sp. (1, flew up into a birch tree). This later sighting is unusually late - I normally see Orange Underwings in March/April. Also good numbers of Brimstones flying today. 13 males, mostly congregating in the Brimstone meadow near School Lane. I finally recorded my first female Brimstone for this site in 2013, initially nectaring on a Dandelion, but soon fighting off the attentions of an amorous male. The rejected suitor then turned up a second female further along the ride, only to suffer a second rejection. With male Brimstone sightings on the common outnumbering females by about 10 to 1 this year, its been a frustrating time for the male Brimstones. The conservation grazing (10 English Longhorn cattle) has resumed on the site & will be present for the next six weeks. Last autumn the cows caused concern by attacking the Brimstones foodplant, Alder Buckthorn. Fortunately their winter retraining programme appears to be working & there is no sign of further damage this year. Also spotted - Peacock (6) Speckled Wood (2), Green-veined White(10, including a mating pair), Large White (1) & Comma (1, egg laying on wild hop). The temperature on the Common reached 14 degrees & the sun lasted until 1.30. The forecast was 10 degrees max & no sun after midday and this made a crucial difference. Important lesson - don't take the weather forecast too literally! - Malcolm Hull

I also saw a comma near Grebe House in St Albans and there was a holly blue there last Thursday (2/5). - Paul Thrush

Finch Lane, Bushey = 9 x orange tip(1 female), 5 x speckled wood, 2 x small white, 2 x large white, 1 x holly blue. In Aldenham Road, Bushey TQ127964 =1 x holly blue(my first this year), 1 x large white. Walk from Finch Lane to Patchmore Heath via cemetary = 2 x peacock, 2 x orange tip(males), 2 x small tortoiseshell, 2 x small white. Lastly Merryhill Fields, Bushey = 2 x orange tip(males), 1 x large white, 8 x peacock, 2 x comma, 7 x brimstone(2 females), 4 x speckled wood, 2 x small white - David Gower

Last Thursday I was poll clerking in a church in Gt.Munden, Herts. Immediately I noticed 3 butterflies trapped against one of the stain glass windows. As we were not rushed off our feet my main concern was to rescue the butterflies. A couple of them appeared to be caught up in some dust and spiders webbing. As the window was quite high up it wasn't easy to get them to come down. In the meantime I found 2 dead ones on the floor and both of them were Peacocks. Eventually between me and the Presiding Officer (I think he thought I was quite obsessed, which I probably was)we managed to get the 3 butterflies to a lower area and I managed to cup them in my hands and take them outside, (not all at once !)Amazingly all 3 were Peacocks. Later we noticed another one flitting around in the church and realised a window was open. We managed to close it and then also rescue this butterfly; again, it was a Peacock - Jan Geggus

Another synopsis of a week with a lot of butterflies. Apologies for the sheer bulk of this message, but it's a good reflection on the weather and the numbers and variety seen.

**1st May** Harmondsworth Moor - After work, I popped into Harmondsworth Moor, as I had exactly a week ago. Within five minutes, I had seen five butterflies of five different species: a Peacock, A Comma, an Orange Tip (at long last!), a Brimstone and a White (Small or Green-veined). This boded well: I set off along the same circuit as last week, and saw many of the same butterflies, mostly Peacocks and Commas, tussling with each other over the same stretches of path. However, I also came across two further Brimstones and several Whites, another Orange Tip and a very worn Small Tortoiseshell. At least two of The Whites were definitely of the Green-veined persuasion, and one obligingly settled to "puddle" on a patch of damp mud. Returning to the car along a shadier part of the path, a Speckled Wood passed in the opposite direction, and near the car park, I spotted a Holly Blue over a tall stand of brambles.

**2nd May** Stanwell Moor - A stroll around my local patch. The first butterfly I saw was a Red

I imagine this was a migrant, as any that overwintered would have appeared before now if they hadn't perished in the prolonged cold winter. This was an aggressive insect, repeatedly diving at me as I tried to photograph a Speckled Wood and seeing off a Holly Blue and then even an unsuspecting Robin. Moving on, it was clear that there had been a significant emergence of Greenveined Whites and Orange Tips. Two of the latter had wasted no time at all, and I found them in flagrante on a bramble - looking somewhat uncomfortable, it must be said. As the sun lowered, the Orange Tips stopped their patrolling and came to a stand of Garlic Mustard where they basked, nectared and settled down - beautifully camouflaged on the flower heads. I also watched a Brimstone make its way amongst the leaves of an ivy plant - effectively disappearing so good was the camouflage. On top of all this, I lost count of the Peacocks and Commas. They were everywhere along the paths, tussling with each other over overlapping territories. Finally, I encountered a Small Tortoiseshell over the nettle beds - looking decidedly worn now.

**3rd May** Stanwell Moor - Early morning for a change, but I just had time for a brief tour of the local patch. Yesterday's Speckled Wood was up and about, but apart from four or five Greenveined Whites, an Orange Tip, and a couple of Holly Blues fluttering around a neighbour's box hedge, nothing else was stirring.

4th May Bedfont Lakes (northern part) - Only a Peacock and a couple of Commas seen at Bedfont.

**4th May** Stanwell Moor - I returned home and did the usual circuit here, which proved a better idea, as I saw two Speckled Woods (both seemed a bit pale, and one had larger spots than usual), and several Commas and Peacocks. I checked a small patch of Cuckoo Flower to find the Orange Tips had got there first: two eggs were in evidence, still quite pale.

**5th May** Stanwell Moor - Within a few metres of the start of today's walk, I had seen a Speckled Wood, a Holly Blue, a Green-veined White, a Peacock and a Comma. As I walked, the sun started to break through a little and it became quite muggy. I saw five or six more Green-veined Whites, a couple of Orange Tips (including one basking way up in a hawthorn tree), two more Holly Blues, and more Peacocks and Commas. I also saw another first for the year, a male Large White which I disturbed nectaring on a dandelion. I also found another Orange Tip egg, quite orange this time, and a couple more of these butterflies roosting amongst the garlic mustard.

**6th May** Stanwell Moor - After my trip to Aldbury Nowers, I went out locally again. Every day is different: today Holly Blues were the most numerous species (thirteen seen altogether), and several more Speckled Woods had emerged too (seven seen in all). Brimstones, Orange Tips, GVW

and Large Whites, Commas and Peacocks completed the picture. It has been a real joy to see so many Peacocks and Commas in recent weeks, and I shall miss being dive-bombed by the former and hustled by the latter when they disappear, probably fairly soon. The Commas in particular are looking very tired now.

**7th May** Stanwell Moor - Work today. However, as it was still warm at six when I returned home, I had to venture out round my home patch just in case. I soon encountered a Speckled Wood and a Green-veined White, both headed for the trees, presumably to roost. A little further on, I found a couple of Orange Tips on a variety of wild parsley. The male was persistently bothering the female, who was displaying the typical abdomen-in-air rejection attitude. Eventually, she became fed up, and flew off across the river. The thwarted male then fluttered around the spot where she'd been for a good five minutes before he gave in and went up into the trees. I carried on to the patch of garlic mustard where I'd seen roosting Orange Tips a few days ago. Sure enough, there were another pair here. The female was still settling down, but I imagine the male had preceded her as he was oblivious to her presence a few flowerheads away. Moving on again I spotted two more, this time a mating pair settled on a bluebell in the low sunshine. Oh, and I also saw three Peacocks, defending their various bits of path to the end of the day.

Once over the county boundary and into the reserve, with its south-facing, sheltered, chalk scree slope (try saying that a few times after a glass of ale), things changed. Within a minute or two, I spotted a Grizzled Skipper, and over the next hour or so I saw at least four definite individuals. There were probably more, but I only photographed four of the nine or ten separate encounters. Brimstones abounded (15+), with both sexes represented, and there were plenty of Orange Tips (12+) and Green-veined Whites (10+) too. At the bottom of the slope, I found two Green Hairstreaks, and as I left the reserve later, another passed me, crossing the county boundary from Bucks into Herts. A sighting record for both counties?

I also saw three Brimstones, including a female, plus three Whites. The only one of these I managed to approach closely was a male Small White with deformed wings - this did not seem to inconvenience him at all. At one point a male Brimstone set off in hot pursuit of a White, and showed no sign of giving up, even forcing it to the ground a couple of times. They normally call it a day quite quickly when they realise the error.

The nettles used by the Comma are in perfect condition for egg laying, whereas the Alder Buckthorn used by the Brimstone appears to be several weeks away from being in suitable condition for egg laying. A stroll around my local patch was in order, and I covered a fair part of it in two hours this morning. The butterflies were out at long last. In all, I counted 21 individuals along the route, with little chance of there being any "repeats". Four species were out and about, and the overall tally was five Brimstones, four Peacocks, four Small Tortoiseshells and no less than eight Commas. A couple of the Commas were indulging in what I took to be courting behaviour, one following the other through the branches of a flowering pussy willow, alighting regularly: one would sidle up close behind the other before the other flew on to another twig where they would repeat the exercise. Eventually, the chasing male (I assume) gave up and went to bask in the sun, whilst the female disappeared into the trees. I was pleased to see so many Small Tortoiseshells (especially as two were at the end of the walk on the grass outside my house!). In recent years, to see one before the summer months around here has been unusual. A long-awaited start to the season here, but a good one. - Dave Miller
