#### June 2017

### Friday 30th June 2017

Bricket Wood Common St Albans - 9 Silver washed fritillaries, including 3 females laying, one on ash and two on birch, 4 White Admirals. Small skipper the only new butterfly out this week - Malcolm hull, Chris Newland, Mandy and Nigel Floyd

Hounslow Heath/River Crane/Marshalling Yards/Pevensey. Despite a lot of cloud this was another good butterfly day with numbers under-counted including Whites which are staring to increase noticeably: Ringlet: 72 Speckled Wood: 8 Green-Veined White: 4 Comma: 8 Purple Hairstreak: 12 Holly Blue: 2 Small White: 7 Marbled White: 2 Gatekeeper: 3 Small Heath: 1 Meadow Brown: 17 Small Skipper: 25 Red Admiral: 3 Tortoiseshell: 1.Very few moths around. - Pete Gore

St Albans - I know everything is early this year but this is ridiculous! NINE Small Tortoiseshells hibernating in my garden shed late morning today. And it's been a nice sunny morning here, so they are not just late up. Also female Brimstone in the garden - Malcolm Hull

# Thursday 29th June 2017

Chorleywood Common, 2 Marbled White - Anna Marett/David Neal

Did my Warren transect in poor conditions (T 16C, no sun, light NW wind) with reasonable results - 33 Meadow Brown, 11 Ringlet, 10 Small Heath, 25 Marbled White, 2 Small Skipper. Most resting in longish grass. Many more off transect, including 12+ very active Small/Essex Skipper on & around a beautiful colony of Betony in full boom. Bees love this for its nectar. It presumably has the same attraction for butterflies - John Moss

# Wednesday 28th June 2017

A cloudy and cooler day at a London Rivers week event with TCV Green Gym at Uxbridge Leisure Centre Pond and Meadow (TQ 06 84) but saw a Marbled White, Small Skipper, Gatekeeper, 4+ Meadow Browns. The TCV project officer mentioned that 10's of Marbled Whites were seen during recent sunny spell at the pond meadow. Further along by the River Pinn Pond (TQ 06 85) we saw another Gatekeeper and 2+ Meadow Brown. Great to see a Kingfisher too. - Paul Busby

### **Tuesday 27th June 2017**

1 Ringlet in flight at Grovelands Park, Southgate this afternoon during rain - Robert Callf

Batford, weedy field - weather condition: dull, 1 Gate Keeper - Darin Stanley

#### Monday 26th June 2017

Bumper day for butterflies on the Lake Transect with over 270 seen with big increases in Meadow Brown, Ringlet and Small Skipper and the first recorded 4 Marbled Whites on this transect. Then Gutteridge Wood Pond Meadow (TQ 09 84), where pond was dry, saw another wandering Marbled White, at least 4 Small Skippers, a Small White, a Speckled Wood, at least 10 Meadow Browns and 7 Ringlets. Then over to Cuttthroat Wood, Hillingdon (TQ 08 84) and saw at least 50 Ringlets, at least 20 Meadow Browns, 2 Speckled Wood, 4 Commas, 4 Large Skippers, 4 Small Skippers, a Small Tortoiseshell, a Six- spot Burnet Moth and a single Gatekeeper in the clearing area. Finally, evening event with 8th Hayes Beavers and saw a Red Admiral perched on Himalayan Balsam by the Yeading Brook (TQ 10 82). - Paul Busby

At around 1315 hours I was scanning the tops of some tall oak trees NE of the footpath from Norton Green leading towards Kitching Lane by Newton Wood. When I approached the middle one I saw a Purple Emperor (unmistakable) in front of me about head high before entering the wood (Pigeonswick) - Peter Clarke

A Silver Washed Fritillary flew into the cottage this afternoon at Rustling End. Male I believe? He has been released back into the garden now - Julie Wise (photo on FB page)

Ruislip Woods One Silver Washed Fritillary (male) this afternoon - Graham Elcombe

On a walk around Tyttenhanger Gravel Pits today I saw approximately 20 Marbled Whites - more than I've seen here before. Also seen were 30 Ringlets, 1 Essex Skipper, 1 Small Skipper, 5 Comma, 6 Meadow Brown, 5 Small White, 3 Green-veined White - Terry Wood

Visited Parkfields Thorley this afternoon. (Large arable field under an impressive crop of barley). TL 467206. Cut off ground between east boundary ditch and by-pass fence, a 400 yds. by 30 yds. piece of tall grass with oak and ash saplings. 34 marbled white, 19 meadow brown and singles of ringlet and large skipper. Continuing for about 200 yds. further along north boundary access track, another 4 marbled white, 8 meadow browns, 7 ringlets plus single large skipper, single small skipper, and a few no I.D. skippers. Thorley Wash transect this morning, For this site, good numbers of meadow brown and ringlet butterflies were seen. Also a few large skippers, 2 gatekeepers and 2 small heath noted. Summer small tortoiseshell numbers diminishing already - Len Crouch

Batford, Weedy field - during solid sunshine & a speedy ramble around the trees during lunch break, found me 4 WHITE LETTER HAIRSTREAK at two separate locations on site, fairly close to each other. First being in trees surrounding a large clump of bramble near the SW corner of the site (where they usually are). Given time, am sure there are several more dotted around. Marbled whites, Ringlets & skippers galore in the area. - Darin Stanley

- my first of the summer brood and 1 male Oak Eggar in flight at South Lodge Farm, Enfield (TQ 298 964) at 14:52 hrs - my first of the year and perhaps earliest ever! - Robert Callf

Hounslow Heath/River Crane/Marshalling Yards/Pevensey. A sunny walk starting in the morning and finishing in the afternoon. Purple Hairstreaks were easier to see than normal,flying around Oaks across the walk,the best count being 6 which I just about managed to keep in view simultaneously around a tree on the Heath. One ventured lower down for a change,settling on a Bramble leaf and even briefly opened its wings before I suspect I disturbed it in my enthusiasm for a closer look. Here are the full details: Ringlet: 53 Small Skipper: 41 Meadow Brown: 37 Purple Hairstreak: 14 Speckled Wood: 4 Comma: 21 Red Admiral: 4 Small White: 6 Tortoiseshell: 1 Marbled White: 1 Gatekeeper: 2 Holly Blue: 1 Small Heath: 2 - Pete Gore

#### Sunday 25th June 2017

Male Purple Emperor seen at 11.15 today at the Grimsdyke hotel in Harrow Weald Middlesex. It was resting on a gravel path for a good 10 minutes. News reported via the Devon Butterfly Recorder

No time to travel today so decided to try my nearest high spot wood near Sawbridgeworth, I can actually see this wood from my landing window, despite the strong winds and very little sun I managed to find a Purple emperor battling its way around a large Ash at the highest point, I got three reasonable sightings between 14.00 and 15.30, hopefully I will try a quick visit tomorrow in better conditions - - Laurence Drummond

Whitewebbs, north Enfield two Purple Emperor in the canopy - Andrew Middleton

Ellenbrook Fields 2 silver washed fritillaries (both male) and one white admiral on brambles on eastern edge of Round Wood - Martin Webb

Harpenden Common: A quick ramble on the Common produced the following butterflies: 6 Comma, freshly emerged and nectaring on the brambles or sunning themselves on the nettles; good numbers of Meadow Brown, Ringlet and Marbled White; 1 Gatekeeper (my first of the season) and a couple of weeks ahead of 2016; 4 Small Tortoiseshell; and 3 Small White. A quick check of a sallow bush revealed several hawkmoth eggs, either Poplar or Eyed, I suspect - David Hunt

Friday 23rd I visited Wormwood Scrubs and was impressed by the high numbers of Small and Essex Skippers around both Creeping Thistle and Knapweed. I positively identified 34 Small Skippers and 24 Essex Skippers which were probably about 10% of those flying. Saturday 24th, an encouraging 4 White Admirals on the Transect plus a 5th on the newly created ride in the south of the wood. Sunday 25th 9 White Admirals on a walk around Bramfield Woods, again an encouraging total, especially in variable weather. 2 Silver-washed Fritillaries nearby too. Videos on our facebook page. - Andrew Wood

Visited Tunnel Gardens this afternoon and identified around 20 ringlets, 5 commas, 2 red admirals, 1 holly blue, 4 small skippers, 1 Essex Skipper, 6 large skippers, 4 meadow brown, 1 white butterfly, and 8 speckled wood.

Went to Ruislip woods today including 12.45 - 2.15 around St Vincent's. No sign of emperors although sun patchy only spotted 4 x speckled wood, 3 x meadow brown and 1 x ringlet. In meadow opposite nursing home 1 x comma , 1 x small tortoiseshell, 2 x small skipper, 2 x large skipper, 22 x meadow brown, 6 x ringlet, 2 x marbled white, 7 x 5 spot narrow bordered burnet moths. Along footpath R40 at top of St Vincent's ( TQ 096 898), 30 x ringlet, 7 x meadow brown, 3 x speckled wood, 1 x large skipper, 1 x comma, 1 x large white. Further on past golf course and next to cemetery ventured into small meadow (TQ 098 900) and was surprised to see 1 x white admiral fly past into brambles. Also seen were 32 x ringlet, 11 x meadow brown, 2 x 5 spot narrow bordered burnet, 8 x large skipper, 3 x comma, 1 x large white. Around Haste Hill station were 18 x ringlet, 11 x meadow brown, 1 x comma, 4 x small skipper, 1 x marbled white. At Poor's field 22 x ringlet, 26 x meadow brown, 2 x marbled white, 2 x large skipper, 2 x comma, 1 x small

tortoiseshell,  $3 \times 3$  small skipper. Lastly at Bushey garden tonight  $1 \times 3$  lesser carpet moth - David Gower

#### Saturday 24th June 2017

Arrived on Hampstead Heath at 13:00 which was a bit later than I'd have liked and saw nothing. Then at 14:50 an Emperor flew onto one of the usual assembly trees. Over the course of the next half hour I watched a few flights over the canopy. The Sun disappeared and down came the rain, the Emperor perched all the while it rained. Once the rain stopped and the sun returned, he leapt over to a different tree and hidden from view. I took my leave but not before checking the Elms nearby and happy to report 2, probably 3 White-letter Hairstreaks. - Frank Nugent

# Friday 23rd June 2017

Hampstead Heath: 2-3 Purple Emperors 1-2 from gateway by mast viewing back to trees over track as previously clashing at 1pm also 1 visible on territory just inside first trees viewed from footpath just in wood by white tissue - Andrew Middleton

Some sightings for Friday 23rd June 2017 - 3 Small Tortoiseshell at Vicarage Farm, Enfield and 2 Small Tortoiseshell at Park Farm, Enfield. Cinnabar larvae seen on Common Ragwort at Park Farm, Enfield and at 'Old Golf Course' Trent Park, also 1 Meal Moth at ASDA Southgate - an appropriate place for one to be? - RM Callf

Hounslow Heath/River Crane/Marshalling Yards/Pevensey, Despite the welcome drop in temperature, breezy conditions and cloudy spells this was a memorable walk with a totally unexpected first-ever and a first of the year shortly following. Unusually I had to wait until the Pevensey loop for the highlights although I'd already been pleased by high numbers and variety throughout the walk. In Pevensey I was trudging along looking vaguely up at the trees when I became aware of a butterfly landing on the nettles alongside the path. I prepared myself to note one of the usual suspects but was shocked to find myself looking at a White Admiral! It perched on the flower-head of a nettle for a little while with wings open, then closed before flying off out of sight.In truth it wasn't an impressive specimen, rather worn and also I thought a little smaller than I'd expect. I'm quessing a wandering male and have no idea where it came from. As far as I know there is no Honeysuckle in Pevensey. I'm not sure about Crane Park. The Marshalling Yards has two or three lots of Honevsuckle but despite willing White Admirals to visit in past years I've never seen any hint and the location and nature of the Honeysuckle seems wrong. Further along in Pevensey I saw my first **Gatekeeper** of the year and one other unexpected sight was a fresh looking male Common Blue as I headed back to the tunnel. I can't be sure which brood this belongs to - there were tatty females around last week. - Pete Gore

Only 1 White-letter Hairstreak (female about knee-height) this time at Six Hills Common at 9:50 am but none in the canopy - possibly due to the breezy conditions. At Norton Green, saw my first Purple Hairstreak about halfway up a large oak on the right of the track. The Ringlet appear to be more common now than the Meadow Brown in the common and several golden skippers (mostly Small but at least one Essex) in the field south of Watery Grove. Other species seen: 2 Red Admiral, 3 Small Tortoiseshell, 2 Marbled White, 1 Common and 1 Common Blue. - Peter Clarke

Being somewhat cooler, if decidedly windy today, my long-planned salutation to the fabled 'weedy field' site, as frequently reported by Darin Stanley in these pages, took place. I had hopes of a White-letter Hairstreak, having previously seen but a single example in an eyeball to compound eye confrontation at the top of an elm tree via a Forestry Commission tower used for investigating the Dutch Elm Disease vectors in the 1970s . It was not to be, however, and most of the (rather puny) elm on site has either died or is beginning to show signs of the malaise. It was by no means a wasted walk as there were abundant Marbled White, Ringlet, Meadow Brown, Small Skipper, Large Skipper, Small Tortoiseshell, and Comma, plus a solitary Small White on this surprisingly neglected patch of land (= earmarked for development?). There were also many Yellow Shell, a few Crambus perlella and a rather gorgeous male Agrion splendens damselfly - if that is not a contradiction. Also on view was a Hornet Mimic Hoverfly nectaring on the bramble. Interestingly, both Large and Small Skippers were abundant, in contrast to the report from the same site by Alan Jackson just two days ago - perhaps indicative of an emergence or wind focusing. On the way back I noted: 2 Small Skipper; 1 Small White; 1 Small Tortoiseshell; 3 Marbled White; and 7 Meadow Brown in the field located between Marquis Lane, Harpenden, and the River Lea (TL151149). Further along, beside Piggottshill Lane (TL150143), a small patch of scrubby land supported veritable swarms of Ringlet plus a few Marbled White, Meadow Brown, Small Skipper, Greenveined White, Comma and Small Tortoiseshell. A freshly dead slow-worm lay on the track, my next vertebrate encounter being a cat lurking a few yards away... Several Common Spotted orchid, by now well into seedhead stage, were visible in the more open areas. An afternoon excursion on Harpenden Common produced Ringlet, Marbled White, Meadow Brown, Small Heath, Small Skipper, Comma, Small Tortoiseshell, Common Blue, and larvae of Cinnabar Moth on ragwort plants. - David Hunt

Butterflies I have seen today 23/06/2017: 2 comma, 1 small skipper (picture on irecord), 2 meadow brown (picture on irecord), 1 small tortoiseshell, 1 unidentified white, 1 speckled wood (picture on irecord) - Westmill Recreation Ground, Hitchin TL1730. - David Inward

First **Gatekeeper** of the year seen at lunchtime on the Belmont Trail, London Borough of Harrow (TQ 16 90). Then late afternoon walk along the River Colne and the Slough Branch of the Grand Union Canal at Cowley Peachey (TQ 05 80) saw at least 4 Commas, 2 Red Admirals, a Large White and at least 3 Small Whites - Paul Busby

#### Thursday 22nd June 2017

6+ Small Tortoiseshell and 7 Ringlet at Vicarage Farm, Enfield. 1 Shaded Broad-bar at Parkside Farm/Res., Enfield (TQ 297 983) - my first of the year, and 1 Ringlet here. 1 Vapourer at Library Green, Enfield Town this afternoon - my first of the year - RM Callf

A much cooler but rather blustery afternoon on Harpenden Common still produced a good haul of butterflies with many Marbled White (including mating pairs); many Meadow Brown; many Ringlet; 1 Small Heath; 1 Small Tortoiseshell; 1 Red Admiral; and 3 Small Skipper (2 males, 1 female). Also good to see 2 Narrow-bordered Five-Spot Burnet, the first ones I have seen on the Common for a good few years (the Six-spot Burnet is usually the one to see, although it has not had a good year since 2014 - and much longer since it was so abundant as to find several of the straw-coloured cocoons on just a single grass stem). Also, a Red Admiral in my Harpenden garden - David Hunt

Harrow Cemetery, 4 Meadow Brown, 11 Ringlet, 1 Comma and 1 Peacock butterfly - Shailesh Patel

Twenty minute visit to the meadow area at Cutthroat Wood, Hillingdon (TQ 08 84) and saw at least 20 Meadow Brown, at least 25 Ringlets, 3 Commas, a Green Veined White, a Large White, 2 Small Tortoiseshell, at least 5 Large Skippers, a Red Admiral, a Speckled Wood and a Brimstone Moth - Paul Busby

Evening stroll around Nomansland Common I saw at least 5 Purple Hairstreaks at 7pm in last sun

rays at top of oaks to east of road. Also plenty of Meadow Browns, a few Marbled Whites and Small Skippers and a Common Blue - Trevor Chapman

# Wednesday 21st June 2017

Today on the Mardley Heath transect a Silver Washed Fritillary on bramble flowers. - Caroline Phillips and Sue Stephens

Seen in Bushey garden today 1 x comma, 1 x small tortoiseshell , 1 x red admiral - David Gower

A few butterflies in Grovelands Park, Southgate this afternoon between 16:30 - 17:55 hrs - 2 Small Tortoiseshell, 3 Comma, 2 Ringlet and 1 Meadow Brown, also a male Beautiful Demoiselle along woodland ride - Robert Callf

After noticing plenty of kidney vetch on the western side of Heartwood, I looked for small blue. Mon 19 June - fairly confident I saw 4, but not 100% as they only transiently settled if at all. Following Andrew Steele's report, I went again: Wed 21 Jun totally confident 2 small blue and humming bird hawk moth on the same patch of vetch. Walked about 250 m south along an approximate line of kidney vetch and saw one more - Martin Webb

Temple View, St Albans -5 White letter Hairstreaks including two pairs of clashing males. Bricket Wood Common - 7 Silver-washed Fritillaries have set up territories along the main ride. 4 White Admirals, all hiding in the woods to escape the 30 degree temperatures. 1 Purple Emperor, hanging round the oak high point in Mutchetts Wood at 1.30. Many more Ringlets emerged in the last few days. And nice to see a new brood Large White, quite a rare sighting in this area in 2017 so far. - Malcolm Hull

A quick visit to Heartwood Forest at lunch time produced 3 Marbled White and 40+ Meadow Brown. There were large numbers of brown butterflies everywhere, but without binoculars and obeying the "Keep out of the long grass" signs made identification difficult. Every one I did manage to ID was a Meadow Brown. Ah well. - Robert Bull

Drawn by an earlier report of a large tree-top butterfly, this morning I visited the 'weedy field' at Batford. Marbled Whites and Ringlets were abundant. Meadow Browns were also plentiful; there was the odd Small Tortoiseshell and Speckled Wood but no Skippers or Gatekeepers. There was not a single butterfly on the buddleias, yet shortly afterwards I had a Comma on my nearby allotment. But this was no 'vinegar trip' (a useful Yorkshire expression for a failed mission): for several minutes I watched a Hornet Mimic Hoverfly (*Volucella zonaria*) beside the footpath. OK, it's not a butterfly and it's not the rarity it once was - but the fact is I've seen more PEs than I have Hornet Mimic Hoverflies! And it was a spectacular insect. Alan Jackson

Hounslow Heath/River Crane/Marshalling Yards/Pevensey. Too hot, despite starting earlier. I walked most of my Heath outward stretch before a first identified butterfly, a very fresh Comma. I continued to see Commas throughout my walk. We may be in for a welcome large brood. On the Marshalling Yards I saw my first Ringlet of the year and towards the end of the inner loop there a first Marbled White briefly seen and beautiful in flight as ever. It seems worth mentioning that the next sequence of significant events almost certainly wouldn't have occurred if I hadn't read the local sightings before leaving and noticed Andrew Middleton's report. ("Too early in the year, wrong time of day," I'd have thought to myself.) As I reached the Elms not far from the railway line -those who attended the recent Branch Walk will know where I mean - I looked up and initially winced with 'pain' as I saw one tree is clearly freshly dying from Dutch Elm disease. Then I thought I saw a small butterfly in the trees and decided that at least this now merited putting in a bit of effort with binoculars. As I began extricating these from my pack a butterfly landed on the path a few yards in front of me. Immediately I thought "White Letter Hairstreak" but I needed to get closer for confirmation, whereupon the butterfly did a rather strange thing. It had landed on Clover and short growing (cut) grass. It proceeded to crawl lower as if trying to get at the roots, and out of sight of me but enabling me to get my head right up close at ground level. I was shortly rewarded by the sight of a tangle of antennae and legs emerging from this strange location (and reminding me of how I must look resurfacing after one of my occasional unplanned descents into a Bramble patch). As the butterfly's hind-wings finally came into view I got the confirmation of bright orange markings I'd sought. It promptly flew strongly off and away as if to say all this had been purposeful and planned. I thought empathy (masking elation) was the best I could offer. We also saw there 5 plus small heath, 5 plus speckled woods, 2 holly blue, 4 common blue, several burnet companions and a mother shipton moth - a good morning - Steve Kiln

1 Painted Lady at Hog Hill, Vicarage Farm at 10:49 hrs and 1 male Large Skipper at Vicarage Farm, Enfield at 11:00 hrs, 1 female Holly Blue E edge of Icehouse Wood, Trent Park at 12:17 hrs, 2 Red Admiral at Trent Park (1 Shaws Wood, 1 along bridle path near Shaws Wood) - RM Callf

# Sunday 28th May 2017

I went back to Westbrook Hav Sunday to have get a better estimate of the Small Blue on this site and one photo would not do it justice. So I send these to you with our story on the Small Blue from the A41 Westbrook Hay so hopefully you can share that on your facebook page and beyond. For it does seem worthy of noting for the Small Blue only being discovered there in 2015! What a weekend it's been for butterflying! I went up to Salcey Forest Saturday to seek Wood White's with Rik Vickers, we were not disappointed and did find this endangered British species and with luck the good management of the forest will continue for the Wood White at this location. Sunday after last weeks preliminary scout at Westbrook Hay, I returned with Rik for the Small Blue for a much more thorough search. Anyway we did a sweep along the slip road and extended down as far as the green road sign on the A41. We were both astonished by the numbers seen there over a hundred! Sightings became less frequent towards the sign but I saw one right beneath it. Which does beg the question are there more beyond the traffic sign? Better still we went onto the reserve directly above and found a small number there too about eight between us suggesting that the Boxmoor Trusts work is a step I the right direction for the Small Blue. Much courtship display was apparent and would seem Cupido Minimus wants to become Cupido Maximus at this site! One early male Meadow Brown and a battered Peacock seen along the A41 as well as numerous species of moth. Back on the Boxmoor Trust reserve Orange-Tip and two Small Copper (one of which was barely bigger than the Small Blue) just off the car park. The Common Blue are gathering in numbers above that A41 stretch where around 30 seen mainly males. There I also got this years first sighting of a Painted lady too. This is also a great place for moths an well worth a visit if your looking to get a good photo of a Small Blue this season. The time is now and wont last long! - Peter Fewell

Hillbrow LGC 15.30 to 16.30, Sunny start but by the time I left there was complete cloud cover. Small Blue (30+), 8 seen together in roost, Kidney Vetch just starting to flower. Common Blue (3m); Brimstone (3); Burnet Companion (5). Roger Millard.

Did the Broxbourne NNR circular walk this afternoon, the meadows at Pembridge Lane Farm looked beautiful with yellow bird's-foot trefoil and buttercups with 3 small copper, 3 small heath, 7 common blue and 2 burnet companion moths as we walked through, elsewhere 7 speckled wood and 1 red admiral.

I've seen so very few on the Heath this year and never more than 1 a day. Although it was unpleasantly humid for much of the branch walk,at this time of year with more and more plants flowering, being out amongst them is always enjoyable and it provided an excellent setting to meet butterfly enthusiasts - Pete Gore with Paul Busby

The 12 Hertfordshire species were at lunchtime around the old Butterfly World perimeter on the footpath from the Rose Gardens (TL12 04) and saw at least 9 Brimstones, one Large White, one male Orange Tip, a Small Copper, just the one Small Blue, a Brown Argus, 6 Common Blues, 3 Red Admirals, a Painted Lady heading northwards, 2 Small Tortoiseshells, 3 Peacock and a Speckled Wood. confronted by a floating Rose Chafer.Although entering the bathroom would have been simple, how it ended up where it was is truly baffling.I rescued it and admired its emerald green iridescence - in many many years of familiarity with this habitat I can certainly say it's the only beautiful thing I've ever seen there! It seemed none the worse for its swim and had departed from the window sill to the garden when I next checked. Its offspring are welcome to "chafe" my roses as much as they like especially if I can meet them next year in a more normal habitat. - Pete Gore

There were easily 5 for every 2 square metres. Within that small quadrant the total was in the region of 45+ individuals. Last year, in the first week of June, my highest count, in this same small area of the meadow, was 11! Also, today, 2 Small Yellow Underwing and 3 Burnet Companion moths. The final tally of species were 10 Dingy Skipper, 5 Common Blue, 2 Brown Argus, 3 Speckled Wood, 1 Large White, 1 Green-veined White, 2 Orange Tip, 1 Holly Blue, 1 Peacock, moths included a mating pair of Phoenix moths, Silver-ground Carpet, Burnet Companion, Mother Shipton, Small Yellow Underwing and *Adela fibulella*. Also one cuckoo and Great-spotted Woodpecker youngsters calling - Andrew Middleton and Liz Goodyear

After the Bovingdon Field Trip we went on to Aldbury Nowers and walked through all the paddocks to the Bucks/Herts border and back. The lower sections were quite poor for butterflies considering the weather conditions had improved and of the specialist species, just 1 Grizzled Skipper was seen near the fenced sheep field and a Dingy Skipper in one other paddock. However in the top sections sightings improved especially when the sun came out properly. Total counts were 10 Grizzled Skipper including some clashes, 11 Dingy Skipper, 4 Green Hairstreak, 9 Brimstone, 10 Brown Argus, 6 Common Blue, 1 Small Copper, 11 Small Heath, 2 Peacock, 1 Red Admiral, moths included Burnet Companion, Mother Shipton, Small Yellow Underwing. On the way home we stopped at the Bourne End sliproad and recorded 8 Small Blue - Andrew Middleton and Liz Goodyear

Aldbury Nowers...the post rain sunshine bought more people than usual here, including a HMWT group studying solitary Bees. Across the whole site I saw 6 male Orange Tip, 4 small heath, 5 male Brimstone, 3 small White, 2 male Common Blue, 1 female Holly Blue, 2 Brown Argus, 3 Dingy Skipper. Also a Treble Bar moth but not sure if it was lesser or not - Chris Hilling

I'm afraid my reports have dropped off rather since April - I will attempt to provide a table of sightings for you from both Stanwell Moor and Bedfont Lakes. The weather has been conducive to seeing butterflies almost every day since mid-March, so there is quite a lot of data. However, here is one noteworthy report from 18th May from Bedfont Lakes CP (north side). Having seen Green Hairstreaks in 2016 on the north side of the railway in the main part of the country park, I was pleased to find one again this year, and laying eggs to boot. I even managed to get a photo of one of the minute bright green eggs on the chosen foodplant (birds-foot trefoil). Also seen were Common Blues, Brown Argus and Small Heaths.

Virtually every gorse clump had a swarm of Grey Gorse Piercer (*Cydia ulicetana*) and, with much satisfaction, I eventually realised the main, and much scarcer, objective of my search in the form of a single Dark Gorse Piercer (*Grapholita internana*). - David Hunt

Hounslow Heath/River Crane/Marshalling Yards/Pevensey. I managed to find a little sunshine and although I had a rather uneven walk with no butterflies at all seen on the Heath I still just about got to double figures plus a first of the year **Cinnabar moth**. This was rather more energetic than they often are, flying past above my head whilst I was in amongst the Gorse on the Marshalling Yards forlornly looking for Green Hairstreaks. With my car in for repairs for the last 7 days, this was my first chance to check the A41 site for Small Blues. The first emergence last year was the 12th May. I was delighted to find that at least **22 Small Blues** were present today. Many were roosting, clinging to stems in the strong winds (https://twitter.com/WildlifeLucy/status/860501505228623872). - Lucy Flower

Hexton Chalkpit - 09.00 to 10.30: Green Hairstreak (3); **Dingy Skipper** (9 including a mating pair). Roger Millard

1 Holly Blue near Triangular Wood, Trent Park at 14:53 hrs and 1 **Mother Shipton** at 'New Fields' Trent Park (TQ 286 965) at 15:08 hrs - my first of the year! 1 male Longhorn Moth (Adela reaumurella) at Covert Way LNR (TQ 265 973) - Robert Callf

Nomansland Common, on a cool and breezy day with sunny intervals, produced the following butterflies: 1 Green-veined White; 1 female Brimstone; 1 Small Tortoiseshell; 1 Peacock; and 2 Speckled Wood. Lots of small moths flying around the gorse bushes with two species identified: *Cydia ulicetana*, the Grey Gorse Piercer, and several of the apparently scarce *Grapholita internana* (Dark Gorse Piercer) at two well separated sites - David Hunt

A few of the butterflies that I saw on Therfield Heath today are listed below. Unfortunately I can't help with the transect counts but I'll try to put in more reports when something interesting crops up on The Heath. You beat me with your brown argus find, but 5 May is unusually early for this butterfly in my part of the world... Seen on Therfield Heath (5 May): 1 brown argus (Church Hill), 3+ small heath, 4+ orange tip, 3 green-veined white, 4 peacock, 2 small tortoiseshell, brimstone, red admiral as well as several unidentified whites. - Martin Johnson

Hounslow Heath/River Crane/Marshalling Yards/Pevensey. Plenty of sunshine but strong breezes

may have discouraged butterflies, particularly on the Heath. Nevertheless I saw my first Small Copper of the year there, one that for some reason favoured the well trodden dry stony footpath as did the only Green Hairstreak seen on the Heath. The other 4 Hairstreaks were all in different parts of the Marshalling Yards, two of them new for this year but favoured in other years. A male and female Brimstone flew slowly just a few inches apart at head height, enabling me to detect both the wing shape and the pale green of the underside of their wings whilst in flight for a change. Other butterflies seen in the Norton Green area: 7 Orange Tip including one roosting on bluebell at around 1015 am just before the sun came out, 3 male Brimstone, 2 Green-veined White and 1 Small White - Peter Clarke

# Wednesday 3rd May 2017

On a truly unpleasant day, with temperatures rarely exceeding 10° C, we undertook some extensive Grizzled Skipper roost counts. Starting at Rickneys in 3 hours (including time spent checking our regular elm for larva) and covering most of the pit we found 26 Grizzled Skipper roosting, 1 Small Copper, **1 Brown Argus** and an Orange Tip. We then went to Waterford Heath North and spent 2 hours looking and finding 16 Grizzled Skipper and **1 Brown Argus**. At Frogmore, the visit was relatively shorter with just over 1 hour spent looking and only 10 Grizzled Skipper and 2 Small Copper (one flying in some brief warmth). Although the large majority of Grizzleds (31) were roosting on Perforate St John's Wort, 7 were on bramble heads and the remainder on some interesting and different choices including hawthorn regrowth, the top of a cut stem, bramble leaf, evening primrose seeds, Carline thistle, figwort stem, ragwort stem, thistle and teasel! Of a more serious note, considering the poor weather, 3 of the Grizzleds found were dead have succumbed to either the cold or a preditor. This was the highest number of dead Grizzled ever recorded in one visit - Liz Goodyear and Andrew Middleton

# Tuesday 2nd May 2017

Sunny spells this morning at Brackenbury Moat site, Ickenham ( TQ072867 ) clearing invasive vegetation and saw at least 3 Speckled Woods, a Peacock, 2 Orange Tips, at least one Green veined White and 1 Small White - Paul Busby

2 Small Copper at Little Mead, Kings Meads today. This is my only regular local site for species. - Simon Knott

Hounslow Heath/River Crane/Marshalling Yards/Pevensey. Some good morning sunshine which unfortunately didn't last for my full walk, the best of it and hence the best of the butterflies coming on the Marshalling Yards. I was particularly pleased that after making a minor seasonal detour for the last 3 years to check out a patch of Gorse and Broom without ever seeing a Green Hairstreak there, today I finally managed to do so although even then it was resting on a Bramble leaf. A second one on the opposite side of the Yards spent a lot of time at ground level moving from plant to plant with a slight preference for Ribwort Plantain - more reminiscent of Small Copper than its own species. The third one, after a skirmish with a Holly Blue, settled for Bramble leaf again. Here are the full details: Holly Blue: 7 Speckled Wood: 4 Orange-Tip: 6 Tortoiseshell: 2 Brimstone: 2 Comma: 1 Green Hairstreak: 3 Peacock: 3. A few unidentified Whites but apart from them I had no Impression of any other species flying today. The absence of Green Hairstreak on the Heath may be due solely to bad timing re sunshine on my part - Pete Gore

Sunny spell on a cooler. blustery day at Cutthroat Wood, North Hillingdon (TQ 08 84) and saw 8 Speckled Wood, 4 Green-Veined White and a Brimstone in the woodland clearing, particularly settling on Stitchwort, now flowering - Paul Busby

Denis and I were on Waterford Heath South pit late this afternoon and in a warm sheltered spot we saw one, possibly two, **Grizzled skippers** on the plentiful wild strawberry at TL317148. We had a quick look at the North pit but it was about 1630 and not so warm and we didn't see any - Christine Shepperson.

Hounslow Heath/River Crane/Marshalling Yards/Pevensey. Intermittent sunshine and none too warm so I was a little surprised by variety and numbers of butterflies: Holly Blue: 5 Orange-Tip: 5 Speckled Wood: 6 Red Admiral: 2 Peacock: 3 Comma: 2 - Pete Gore

Decided to visit one of the 2km squares in TL41 with no recent records today. Despite a cold fresh wind, sheltered areas were warm so I took these sections slowly and the open areas more quickly. I started in Eastwick Village (TL4311) and in total saw 1 Speckled Wood (almost immediately and not one again), 3 Orange Tip, 1 Red Admiral, 1 Peacock and 1 Small White. I then walked up Eastwick Hall Lane to TL4212 (my target 2km), across towards Gilston Park and Home Wood, and then north-west towards Hunsdon Airfield, stopping short as it was far too exposed and back down

the delightful Cock Robin Lane and then returned down Eastwick Hall Lane. In total across the square I recorded an amazing 14 Small Tortoiseshell, 5 Peacock, 13 Orange Tip (mostly but not all males), 1 Brimstone (male), 1 Holly Blue, 2 Green-veined White, 2 Small White and the star of the day in the most unlikely barren location on the edge of arable fields although close to the edge of Home Wood near Gilston Park a pristine **Small Copper**. Considering how poor numbers were last year, this really was a surprise. Also the 2km square has a very high elm count, all of which is heavily seeded at the moment - Liz Goodyear

I counted the Tortoiseshells hibernating in my shed and six had left since last Sunday, though 21 are still fast asleep. One had become trapped in cobwebs behind a fixed window and appeared dead. But once I'd carefully removed the cobweb it shot off, flying three times round the garden at high speed before sunbathing on the fence. Judging by the numbers of Tortoiseshells which hibernated through the winter, 2017 promises to be a very good year for this species. But don't expect numbers on the wing to increase rapidly. Tortoiseshells now vary their flight times enormously and based on recent years experience it's likely to be another two months before they have all left hibernation. A very different story for Peacocks. Just two seen on the wing today and the only one hibernating in the shed vanished during the winter. My expectation is that this species will have a poor year locally. One Red Admiral also seen today, but the Commas and Brimstones from last week were not seen at all - Malcolm Hull

Here is the summary: Brimstone: 3 Comma: 2 Small White: 1 Peacock: 1 Tortoiseshell: 1. There were also 3 smaller brightly orange sightings, the first doing a believable imitation of a Small Copper, rising from the short grass in front of me and flying strongly over an Oak tree. The next two were much less convincing in that role however, circling around the top of a group of Silver Birches: Orange Underwing moths all three, I presume although I got no close up view of any of them. - Pete Gore

Today's warm sun brought a Brimstone to my Harpenden garden this morning - it was quickly followed by four more. First garden butterflies of the year - Alan Jackson

We saw 1 small tortoiseshell and 4+ commas while working at Danemead today - Jenny Sherwen

My first butterfly sighting of the year today - 1 Red Admiral at Shaws Wood, Trent Park (TQ296971) at 12:53 - 12:55 hrs - Robert Callf.

St Albans - **Comma** in my garden at 9.30 am, my first butterfly of the year. Male Brimstone mid morning, hurtling down the road. Red Admiral and Comma sunbathing in my garden at lunchtime. #### Friday 17th February 2017

Stanwell Moor: The weather was fine and sunny - probably warmer than yesterday in fact. I was lucky enough to have a day off work and decided to look around my local patch to see if an old adage was right: one fine day to wake them up and a second fine day to make them fly. It certainly seemed to be true and my season was quickly off to a cracking start with a nice **Red Admiral** basking on the brambles. Shortly afterwards I spotted a **Comma** low down on some ivy - unusual for me to see a Comma before any Peacocks. Further on again, two more butterflies: another Red Admiral on some metal piping, and behind it a **female Brimstone** fluttering around. The latter came to ground a little way off, just within the range of the zoom. Unusual again to see a female before a male, especially so early in the year. I carried on to the area I have dubbed Comma Corner, and appropriately at the apex of the eponymous spot sat another Comma. It

didn't stay long as it soon set off after another of the species and I lost track of them both. Six butterflies: three species. The season doesn't start better than this!
