


Brown Hairstreak






Newly found in Middlesex during this period, mainly records from winter egg hunts.

Small Blue



A return or re-finding at a number of mainly chalky sites during this period. Worth looking wherever there is kidney vetch, which is unfortunately not widely distributed.

Marbled White




To show the east and southwards expansion of this now common species over the last three 5 year periods




Purple Emperor



The mobility of this species across the landscape is illustrated by the spread of dots and by previously recorded squares with no records in the last 5 year period. The whole map shows the wide distribution outside the very built-up areas.




Golden Skippers



The decline of the three "golden" skippers, particularly the Small and Essex









Declining across much of Britain, confined to wood large enough to have shaded honeysuckle

Small Tortoiseshell








The decline in numbers and distribution in 2005 to 2009 followed by a recovery in the last two periods but note that numbers in any square are much lower in the last 5 years



Painted Lady






Chalkhill Blue



The open circles show the great dispersal in the bumper year of 2013, but the current period has seen lower numbers and a confinement to the traditional sites. With just a couple of new colonies not too far from them.



Small Copper



The alarming fall in distribution and numbers in 2016 and the recovery in 2017-2019. It is not always clear why we get a sudden drop like this or the recovery.
