Small Blue is Rare in Herts and Under Threat



- Small Blue has never been common in Herts.
- In the 1980's it was still found on the chalk hills in north & west Herts.
- Numbers declined and it died out due to the loss of suitable habitat
- By 2004 there were no breeding colonies left in our county.
- From 2009 onwards it started a recovery, first around Tring
- In recent times, the largest colony has been at the former Butterfly World, Chiswell Green

Herts & Middx Small Blue Project

- Aim to create a network of sustainable sites.
- Improve management of existing sites.
- HMBC funded Kidney Vetch planting at Heartwood Forest and Small Blue is now thriving there.
- Butterfly World is currently suffering from neglect & is potentially threatened by development.
- So we are aiming to develop new sites nearby to sustain the local population.

Building a Chalk Bank for Butterflies in Greenwood Park

- Researching & designing a scheme
- Agreement with the landowner,
 St Stephen Parish Council
- Securing a grant from the Heritage Lottery Fund
- Employing a contractor to build the bank
- Recruiting volunteers branch members, local people and the staff and pupils of Killigrew School all helped.
- Planting & seeding the bank
- Designing temporary posters & permanent Display Boards




