11:30 Meet the new Chair of Trustees - my background and thoughts about Butterfly Conservation - Martin Spray

Martin would like to hear members' views on Butterfly Conservation and welcomes the opportunity to talk to you during the day

Martin was elected Chair of the Trustees in November 2023. Now retired, Martin's career included 14 years in public organisations, followed by 32 years in the nature conservation sector.

- 14:00 British and Irish Butterfly Rarities Peter Eeles

The theme of Peter's talk with our changing butterfly fauna - specifically, extinctions (such as the Black-veined White and Large Copper), rare migrants (such as the Camberwell Beauty and Long-tailed Blue) or introductions (such as the Geranium Bronze). There are 59 butterfly species that are considered resident or regular migrants to Britain and Ireland, yet there are another 63 species in the official checklist whose story deserves to be told.

Peter has always been interested in nature and butterflies in particular - fostered by a childhood spent in rural Gloucestershire. In 2002 he created the UK Butterflies website and is currently in his second stint as Chair of the Hampshire and Isle of Wight Branch of BC. He was presented with the Marsh Award for the Promotion of Lepidoptera Conservation in 2016 and has authored two butterfly-related books - Life Cycles of British and Irish Butterflies (2019) and British and Irish Butterfly Rarities (2023). He retired from a 35-year

career in IT in 2022 and now works part-time as an independent ecologist and website developer.

HOW TO GET TO THE MEMBERS' DAY

By Rail:

Nearest stations – Abbey Line (Watford Junction – St Albans Abbey) How Wood or Park Street, less than 5 minutes by car, or an approx. 20 minute walk - see Abbey Line for timetable www.abbeyline.org.uk.

By Bus:

652 St Albans – Watford stops outside the centre – see Intalink for timetable www.intalink.org.uk.

By Car:
