Covid19 hasn't gone away but with government restrictions lifted at the time of preparing our programme, we hope that a full programme of butterfly walks and moth events will go ahead. However, we have still retained the need to pre-book some of our events due to their popularity or reduced parking availability. Please check the national website regularly if you know you want to attend a particular walk in case circumstances have changed. The Herts & Middlesex Wildlife Trust do not at present have any butterfly walks included in their programme but are hopeful a few might be added in due course. Some of the events listed have been arranged by the Big City Butterflies Project but are open to all members, although booking requirements will vary depending on the type of event and each individual partner organisation!


